- 1. Yury A., 54** (Netania) **\$200**
Yury is a victim of terrorist attack at Netania mall in 2001. Yury is 100% handicapped – undergone several open heart surgeries, legs are partially paralyzed. Yury lives alone in a tiny apartment – one 9 m² room, kitchen the size of a closet. Apartment complex is in dilapidated condition. Yury uses a cane to get around his apartment and cannot walk beyond it.
- 2. Linda B., 35** (Zefat) **\$500**
Husband Itzik (40) died in the bombing near Tel Aviv night club in February 2005, Linda was severely injured in the same attack. Two children – Daniel, 10 and Stav, 3.
- 3. Rivka A., 60** (Tel Aviv) **\$200**
Lost her son Ronen (29) in the bombing near Tel Aviv night club in February 2005. Rivka does not work.
- 4. Vitaly P., 70** (Hadera) **\$400**
Vitaly and his wife Genya were the victims of the bombing at Hadera market on 10/25/05. Genya died in the hospital 5 days later. Vitaly was severely injured in both legs; there is a risk of amputation of the right leg. Vitaly was still in the hospital two month after the attack. His son Leonid takes care of him at the hospital. Leonid works at a factory, may not be compensated for the leave of absence time while he takes care of his father. Leonid's wife does not work. They have three children, the youngest girl is 9 months old, was taken care of by the grandmother before the attack.
- 5. Liza K., 65** (Hadera) **\$400**
Lisa is a widow, her husband Mikhail died in Hadera market, 10/25/05. Her son Alexander is divorced, has two children of school age, Mikhail was taking care on the younger grandchild after school, now Lisa is doing it. Lisa works as a home health aide, she used to have three clients. She is back to work, but reduced her workload to one client in order to take care of the grandchild after school. Alexander just underwent angioplasty surgery (~11/15/2005) and spent a week in the hospital; he was told that his heart problem was stress-related.
- 6. Boris G., 36** (Hadera) **\$1000**
Larisa Grischenko (36) is in deep coma after very severe head injury at Hadera market 10/25/05. Chances for her to recover or even survive are very slim. The family has 3 children: Yana (11), Daniel (4 years 2 months), and Diana (2 years 9 months). Boris stays at Larisa's bedside in the hospital and doesn't go to work. It is unclear whether he will get any compensation for the time away from work. The family lives in a rental apartment. Boris's mother Maria quit her job in order to take care of the children. Both Larisa and Boris are pharmacists, worked as the heads of pharmacies. Boris's parents both used to worked, now only his father works (at a factory).
- 7. Lapid School** **\$200**
Lapid School is non-profit organization that helps teenage victims of terror to catch up with their school work and recover psychologically from trauma.
