

“LAPID” MEANS TORCH OF HOPE

Rehabilitation – Educational Center for children-victims of terror in Israel

In the past 5 years since September 2000, over 1,000 people were killed and about 7,000 people were injured in terrorist acts in Israel. About 20% of victims are recent immigrants from the former Soviet Union. Hundreds of children were injured, many had several surgeries, and some were left disabled for life. Thousands children have lost parents, grandparents, siblings or close friends and suffer from the psycho trauma or post-traumatic disorder. “The children of Israel have been living with abnormally high levels of stress for more than two and a half years,” says Ruth Pat-Horenczyk, Ph.D., a clinical psychologist and director of child and adolescent clinical services at the Israel Center for the Treatment of Psycho trauma in Jerusalem.

Many children have to be treated for several years; they fall behind the rest of their class and need individual tutoring. Many have serious medical and psychological problems which parents unable to resolve. Sometimes, parents of injured children themselves are in critical need of psychological, social and legal help. Families of recent immigrants with injured children are especially in desperate situation. The initial screening of 50 such families revealed that each of them has multiple problems. *The Vadim Nurzhits International “Lapid” School (Rehabilitation – Educational Center)* has been organized in 2003 for comprehensive rehabilitation of injured or affected children. Headquarters of the “*Lapid*” School is located in Or Akiva in Israel, but it serves children in Haifa, Tel-Aviv, Sderot, Jerusalem, Hadera, Beer-Sheva, Holon, Rishon LeZion. 20 teenagers with their parents and representatives of AAJFSU came to the official opening of the school which took place in Or Akiva on September 24, 2003. The “*Lapid*” School doesn’t have yet paid personnel and financing, but its volunteers – medical doctors, psychologists, teachers and social workers – evaluated injured or affected children, revealed problems of each child and try to resolve them. The injured children are happy to see volunteers of the “*Lapid*” School. “*You just started, but your Torch throws already light upon our painful path and helps us and our injured children to survive and to overcome our difficulties. Thank you!*” – Maxim Malchenko’s mother wrote to the “*Lapid*” School (he was injured in the terrorist act at the Tel-Aviv Disco “Dolfi,” on June 1, 2001).

Considering the work of the “*Lapid*” School exceptionally important, the American Association of Jews from the Former USSR, Inc. (AAJFSU) and the World Congress of Russian Jews (WCRJ) decided to support its enthusiasts and started fund-raising for the “*Lapid*” School. The AAJFSU opened a special account for the school (100% of the collected money transferred to the “*Lapid*”). In 2004, a minivan was bought and psychological treatment of the first “*Lapid*” students started. The collection goes on. **These injured Israeli children, victims of Arab terror, badly need our help! We have to help!**
